WELCOME to Worship tonight! What a joy to be together in Christ! Please fill out the "Member" or "Guest" side of our Communication Card located in each pew. Please place them in the offering plate or hand to an elder during the singing of the first hymn. Prayer request cards are also available. Again, welcome!

THE LORD'S SUPPER is offered tonight to all Confirmed members of our congregation.

+ **For personal preparation for communion**, use the following prayers:

Before communion (communing): Dear Savior, at Your gracious invitation I come to Your table to eat and drink your holy body and blood. Let me find favor in Your eyes to receive this Holy Sacrament in faith for the salvation of my soul and to the glory of Your holy name; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

After Communion (Thanksgiving after receiving the Sacrament): Almighty and everlasting God, I thank and praise You for feeding me the life-giving body and blood of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Send Your Holy Spirit that, having with my mouth received the holy Sacrament, I may by faith obtain and eternally enjoy Your divine grace, the forgiveness of sins, unity with Christ, and life eternal; through Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen

+ **Lutherans** who are in good standing with their own congregations of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod (LCMS) are welcome to join with us in receiving this blessed meal.

+ **Guests** are asked to speak with the Pastor or elder **before** communing that they may properly understand the Lutheran teaching on the Lord's Supper.

+ **Children, Teens, and Adults** who have not yet completed confirmation instruction are invited to come forward with their row and cross their arms in front of their chest to receive a blessing from the Pastor during distribution.

+ **White grape juice** is available from the center of the individual cup tray.

+ **Gluten-Free wafers** are located in the silver dish at the center of the altar for you to pick up as you come forward. Standard wafers will be distributed to other communicants during the Distribution of the Supper.

+ **Communion at the pew** is available at the start of Distribution to those who sit in the second pew on either side.

+ **Those with wheelchairs or walkers** are invited to come forward with others who are communing. However, anyone who wishes to receive Communion at your seat please speak to an Elder or the Pastor prior to the start of Worship.

AS WE GATHER

On this night known in the Church as Holy Thursday, Jesus invites us to join Him once again at His Table. He knows our need for strengthening and reassurance. The place in which we gather is filled with the blessing of fellowship as we remember the new command of our Lord Jesus to love one another. Our Lord serves us in many ways, most singularly as the Host at His Table, where we receive His body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. Time and again we are invited to return to the Table, where truly we experience a foretaste of the feast to come.

Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born.”²²And as they were eating, he took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to them, and said, “Take; this is my body.”²³And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, and they all drank of it.²⁴And he said to them, “This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many.²⁵Truly, I say to you, I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God.”²⁶And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.



- P** Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My † body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My † blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

Proclamation of Christ

- P** As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

THE STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

We prepare our sanctuary and our hearts to remember the death of our Lord, and prepare for Good Friday. While this is done, Psalm 22 is read responsively and leave in silence, returning tomorrow to continue this service of worship

Psalm 22

P David was inspired to write Psalm 22, which Jesus may have prayed on the cross. We use it to end this evenings' service.

P My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?

Why are You so far from saving Me, from the words of My groaning?
O My God, I cry by day, but You do not answer, and by night, but I find no rest.

C **Yet You are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel.**

P In You our fathers trusted; they trusted, and You delivered them.

C **To You they cried and were rescued;
in You they trusted and were not put to shame.**

P But I am a worm and not a man,
scorned by mankind and despised by the people.

C **All who see Me mock Me;
they make mouths at Me; they wag their heads;**

P "He trusts in the LORD; let Him deliver Him;
let Him rescue Him, for He delights in Him!"

C **Yet You are He who took Me from the womb;
You made Me trust You at My mother's breasts.**

P On You was I cast from My birth,
and from My mother's womb You have been My God.

C **Be not far from Me, for trouble is near,
and there is none to help.**

P Many bulls encompass Me;
strong bulls of Bashan surround Me;

C **they open wide their mouths at Me,
like a ravening and roaring lion.**

P I am poured out like water, and all My bones are out of joint;
My heart is like wax; it is melted within My breast;

C **My strength is dried up like a potsherd,
and My tongue sticks to My jaws;
You lay Me in the dust of death.**

P For dogs encompass Me; a company of evildoers encircles Me;
they have pierced My hands and feet
