## New Communion Ware

The new communion ware includes a chalice, paten, ciborium, flagons, and individual trays, each crafted with an eye-catching combination silver and polished gold.

The rough silver of the communion ware represents the rock of the church, a foundation that is steadfast and enduring. Just as a rock is unyielding and provides a solid base, the church stands as a pillar of faith, offering stability and support to its congregation. Our church's name, "St. Peter's" means "Rock," which makes our new set fitting for our use. The texture of the silver, with its rugged appearance, reminds believers of the trials and tribulations that have shaped and strengthened the Church over centuries.

Contrasting the silver, the gold elements of the communion ware are reserved for the most sacred act of the Eucharist. Gold, with its lustrous shine, represents purity and divinity. In the context of communion, the gold contains and delivers the body and blood of Jesus Christ. The chalice, with its golden interior, holds the wine, which during the sacrament, is the blood of Christ. Similarly, the paten and the ciborium, which holds the hosts, are adorned with gold to signify the sacredness of Christ's body they carry.
